Primer makes a difference, choose wisely...

I am hoping that the club members are showing the same spirt with their December contest build. Personally, I'm making progress, though not as much as I'd like. I had been spending more time wrenching on my Corvette.

If you recall from last month's newsletter article, I've been prepping the '72 Nova body for paint But before I spray it with primer, I wanted to investigate the effects that the primer color has on the color coat and share my finding with you. Some modelers say that it has little or no effect while others claim there is a significant difference. I have referred to Don Yost who is best known for his instructional DVD's on painting and building show quality model cars to get his expert opinion on this question.

Don takes 4 different hoods and paints with black, dark gray, light gray, and white primer (sorry no primer red). He then follows up by painting each of the hoods with Stop Light Red Metallic, a Testors color. The results are significant, yielding four different shades of metallic red.

Since my plan is to replicate my first car, Burnt Orange is my color of choice. Based on Don's and my own experimentation, I will be spraying the body with a light gray primer followed by 10 mist coats of Dupli-Color Orange Mist (which is close to GM's Burnt Orange).









Clearly the primer you use will make a difference in the shade of your color coat. Choose wisely...

Model Industry News & More from the VP

Wow here we are into September. Where did the year or summer for that matter go? Really strange with no shows, swap meets or very few club meetings. Really appreciate the use of Kenny's and Joe's homes and Humberto's shop for meetings. It's nice to get out of the house during this Pandemic. Cannot wait until things get back to normal or at least as close as possible.

Well there are some new or rather reissues coming this month and next month. First off, I want to tell you about MPC's much awaited reissue- Bill Grumpy Jenkins Vega Pro Stock. This kit has never been re-issued before now and is getting low on stock at supplier's warehouses. Most hobby shops knew this would be an issue and ordered a large order. But with demand they are running short. Round 2 has started a 2nd order and expect them to sell out just as quickly. This 2nd run is not expected until late October or early November.

For the construction equipment builders the International Payhauler 350 is available. Now for the car builders and show car builders there several new re-issues. MPC has the 32 Chrysler Imperial Convertible coupe with all of the parts restored from the Gangbusters issue. This is available now. Also from MPC is the TIKI Trike show car/bike (?) which also is available now. In the same series is the show rod of the LIL Gypsy Wagon show rod.

Coming in early September is the Deutz D30 farm Tractor from Revel of Germany. AMT has the 69 Ford Torino Cobra fastback. AMT also has the 1957 Ford T-bird (1/16), and 1995 Mitsubishi Eclipse. From Revel will be a re-issue of the 62 Chevy Impala (formal roof), a 78 Chevy Camino and a new tooling of a 71 Plymouth GTX from the Fast & Furious movie (Dom's car).

Available soon is a 64 Plymouth Belvedere hard top with 2 engines, a slant 6 and a V8 (not a Hemi) This kit was originally released as a Polar Lights kit. Now has been rebadged as an AMT kit. No changes from the Polar Lights version just re badged- AMT.

October will see the 65 Ford Galaxie 3in1 gasser, the "Jolly Green Gasser from AMT. Tamiya is trying to fill the void left by Testors with some new colors. For the US market only is a pearl blue spray TS89, a black rubber spray TS82, a decal set "Mark Fit Strong" decal solution TAM-87135 and a black panel line accent color TAM-87131.

For the book collectors are 2 new books by Tim Boyd; Collecting Drag Racing Model Kits (\$32.90) and Collecting Muscle Car Kits (\$29.90) both due out in early September.

Look for the new paints from Revel at your nearest hobby store. They were due out in the US in August.

So for now stay safe, wear your mask and social distance.

It's NOT sold in stores. I've used the paint on my REAL engine as I recently restored my engine in my '68 AMC Ambassador SST Coupe.




Joe's '68 Ambassador SST with the restored 343 Typhoon 4bbl engine

The Kit Review Corner...

Revell 1969 Opel GT 1/32 scale vintage kit review, by Joe Salzburg

Skill Level: 3, Number of Parts: 25, Price: About \$17.00 and Up.

News This kit is a re-issue of the original old Revell 1:32nd scale Snap-Together kit from back in the day. The has been reissued by Revell of Germany as a well, Not quite a Snap-Together, but a Glue-Together kit? Well it's a Level 3 Build Kit, so one would guess that this kit SHOULD have some level of difficulty. But really, I don't think so. First off, the level of detail is very minimal.



There is a total of 25 pieces to the kit with a simple, but interestingly waterslide... Not Peel & Stick decals. The body has minimal engraving and not very good engraving. There are NO separate lights or lenses. The

"Pop-Up" headlights are closed with decals for the side marker lights and the tail lamps.



You will also NOT find any chrome in the kit. The bumpers and wheels are molded in a gray. The body, interior tub, dashboard, seats, chassis, inner wheels and axles are all molded in an orange. The front bumper/grill and rear bumperettes, along with the steering wheel are molded in gray. The four tires are molded in a rubber/vinyl and there is a one-piece clear unit for the glass.

The chassis as you might guess is fairly simple, with holes for the large plastic axles and all the usual things (Exhaust, driveshaft, gas tank, suspension, etc.). Thick plastic axles stick through the chassis holes and plug into the rudimentary wheels supplied.



The interior is simply a dashboard, two seats and the tub. All go together relatively easily as you might guess. Yes, again this is based on the old "Snap-Together" kit from '69, but glue of course is best to be used to ensure the interior parts do stay put. Detail in the tub is minimal at best... EXTREMELY minimal. So adding detail of any kind, would certainly help this model with more realism. Seats have NO seatbacks, but the instrument cluster does have some promise as it has a good shape



with some detail AND... AND... there are actually details for the instruments, radio and HVAC controls. Seriously... For some reason, Revell-Hobbico seemed like they wanted to try and make this kit more than what it actually was or is. That being a basic children's Snap-

Together kit. The steering wheel takes you back to what this kit is, as it's a very basic 3-spoke wheel that could have been used for any number of Revell 1:32nd scale snappers of the day.

Assembly is quick and easy, but when it comes to final details, as in the chrome... Remember... There is none. You will have to either spray them a "Chrome" type of paint or Bare Metal Foil them, etc. etc. Otherwise, they are a medium gray color that the parts are molded in. Any detail in the grill or the wheels will have to be done on your own. There are no side view or rear-view mirrors. No tail pipes. No detail like that. However, the decal sheet comes to the rescue again with not only the marker and taillights, but also ALL the emblems and center caps for the minimalist 5-spoke wheels.



All in all, this again is a very simple reissued kit that came out in 2016 from Revell-Hobbico. If you are looking for something more detailed, simply buy the 1:25th scale AMT kit from several years ago. That is a true Level 3 or 4 Glue kit with ample detail, including an engine. But for something of a quick-build, or something small and cute for the shelf. Or if you are "Superfan" of this car... Which let's face it... For many of us, it was like a "Baby Corvette" with its styling way back when. Hardly a Vette, but still a great looking little sports car from Opel.

Tech Tip of the Month - provided by Craig Zaplatynsky

Not all of us have a large collection of model car bodies and hoods for performing color test sprays. The use of styrene plastic spoons for this type of testing paint is an easy and inexpensive way to go. The key here is that the spoons should be made of styrene plastic. Thought the styrene plastic spoon is not exactly the same material as your model, it's close. Spray both sides of the spoon to get an idea of how the color reflects light.

Be sure to indicate with a sharpie the primer and color you used on the unpainted handle for future reference.
